### D. MEASURES OF PROTECTION

#### 1. Coverage

About 156 million people will work in OASDI-covered employment in 2010.

About 93 percent of workers in paid employment and selfemployment are covered under the OASDI program.

### 2. Benefit receipt among the elderly

As of December 31, 2009, about 90 percent of the population aged 65 and over were receiving benefits.

# 3. Protection for survivors of young workers

About 97 percent of persons aged 20-49 who worked in covered employment in 2009 have acquired survivorship protection for their children under age 18 (and surviving spouses caring for children under age 16).

# 4. Disability protection

About 91 percent of persons aged 21-64 who worked in covered employment in 2009 can count on monthly cash benefits if they suffer a severe and prolonged disability.
