Protecting your investment in Social Security

People who apply for or who receive benefits are required to give us accurate information about their income, living arrangements, medical condition, and other details that affects their eligibility or amount of benefits. We investigate persons who provide false, incomplete, or inaccurate information, or who fail to tell us about a change in their circumstances that affects their benefits (such as starting to work or moving) for potential fraud.
