IT Specialist

Information Technology (IT) Specialists at Social Security apply cutting-edge technologies to maintain and create our systems and keep them up to date with constantly changing agency programs. IT Specialists do everything from managing computer needs for the support staff to building the programs that employees use to process claims for Social Security benefits. We have many IT roles including Software Developers, Cyber Security Specialist, System Administrators, Network Administrators, Project Managers, Testing Specialist, Help Desk Support, and Database Administrators.

Requirements & Qualifications

To qualify, you must be a U.S. citizen and have excellent customer service, communication, problem solving, and analytical skills. Additional qualifications are as follows:

Grade 5 Minimum Qualifications

A Bachelor's degree.

Grade 7 Minimum Qualifications

- (1) graduating with at least a 3.0/4.0 GPA; (2) graduating in the top third of the graduating class; or (3) membership in a national scholastic honor society. One full year of graduate level study/ Master's or higher degree
- At least 52 weeks of specialized experience. Such IT-related experience includes assisting senior specialists with application troubleshooting, computer programming, hardware or software configuration, etc.

Grade 9 Minimum Qualifications

- A Master's or equivalent graduate degree OR
- Successful completion of two full years of progressively higher-level graduate education leading to a master's or equivalent graduate degree OR
- At least 52 weeks of specialized IT experience at the GS-7 level

Based on your qualifications such as experience, education, or a combination of both, you may be considered for positions at the GS 11-15 grade level.

Educational Degree

The educational degree must be in a computer science, engineering, information science, information systems management, mathematics, operations research, statistics, or technology management; or a degree that provided a minimum of 24 semester hours in one or more of the fields identified above and required the development or adaption of applications, systems or networks. Transcripts are required to substantiate education.

Excellent Benefits

- Earn 13 paid vacation days a year, then
 - » 20 days a year after 3 years
 - » 26 days a year after 15 years
- Earn 13 paid sick days each year
- 11 paid Federal holidays
- Health benefits including medical, dental, and vision; and access to flexible spending accounts
