Interesting Facts from SSA's National Beneficiary Survey (NBS)

How do SSA beneficiaries with disabilities rate their health?

- Overall, nearly three-quarters of beneficiaries with disabilities (73%) rate their health as no better than "fair."
- Far more beneficiaries with disabilities think their health has gotten worse in the last year (41%) than feel their health has gotten better (16%).
- There is a strong link between self-reported health status and work.
 - Nearly 60% of working beneficiaries rate their health as being "good" to "excellent" as compared to 24% among non-working beneficiaries.
