

Request Your Replacement Social Security Card Online

1. After signing in to your personal **my Social Security** account at **www.ssa.gov/myaccount**, select the “Replace your Social Security Card” link.
3. Enter the information under “Identity Verification” including your name, Social Security number, date of birth, driver’s license or state-issued identification information, address, and phone number.

You can request a replacement Social Security card online if you:

- Are a U.S. citizen age 18 or older.
- Have a driver’s license or state-issued identification card from one of the participating states or the District of Columbia (to see if your state participates, go to **www.ssa.gov/ssnumber**).
- Have a U.S. mailing address (this includes APO, FPO, and DPO addresses).
- Have a **my Social Security** account.
- Don’t require changes to your name, date of birth, place of birth, or gender.
