

## *Scott L. Frey*



### *Chief of Staff Social Security Administration*

Mr. Frey is the Chief of Staff of the Social Security Administration (SSA). Throughout his career, he has been a champion of programs that help working families, with a consistent focus on labor rights, health, and retirement policy. As Chief of Staff, Mr. Frey works closely with Acting Commissioner Kijakazi, serving as the White House Liaison, and communicates regularly with members of Congress and their staffs to ensure they understand the needs of SSA to effectively improve Social Security for all Americans.

Prior to becoming Chief of Staff in January 2021, Frey was appointed to the Biden-Harris Social Security Administration Transition Team starting in October 2020. Before joining the Biden-Harris Administration, he served for six years as Director of Federal Government Affairs at the American Association of State, County and Municipal Employees (AFSCME), AFL-CIO.

During the Obama-Biden Administration, Frey served as Deputy Commissioner for Legislation and Congressional Affairs at SSA, overseeing the agency's regulatory and legislative activities. Prior to joining SSA, he served as Executive Director of the National Committee to Preserve Social Security and Medicare (NCPSSM) Foundation.

Frey's early work with the U.S. House Select Committee on Aging led to the enactment of landmark legislation related to elder abuse prevention and to the expansion of preventive health coverage under Medicare. His legislative work also contributed to vastly expanded research on age related illness and women's health at the National Institutes of Health. He has been honored by the Alliance for Aging Research for "exceptional dedication to older Americans."

Mr. Frey also received an official commendation from the Commissioner of Social Security for outstanding public service.

Between 1999 and 2010, Frey was appointed by the Mayor and City Council of Alexandria, Virginia to three terms on the Alexandria Commission on Aging and one term on the Alexandria Commission on Persons with Disabilities.

Frey has more than 30 years of legislative and policy experience in Washington, DC, and has spoken to audiences across the country about Social Security and Medicare. In addition to working as a legislative advocate at NCPSSM, he has held positions at Mary Rose Oakar & Associates, Inc., the National Institutes of Health, and has served as staff for two U.S. Congressmen.

Mr. Frey earned his M.A. in Political Theory and B.A. from Duquesne University.

Mr. Rollins joined the Social Security Administration (SSA) in 2019. Before joining SSA, he was the Director of the Pennsylvania Bureau of Disability Determination for over four years. He entered that position after owning and managing Rollins Law Office where he worked for 15 years. In this capacity, he represented individuals with cases involving Social Security Disability Benefits and Supplemental Security Income at the administrative and federal court of appeal levels. He was a former legal counsel to the United States Department of Health and Human Services Office of General Counsel. Mr. Rollins has lectured on Social Security law for many organizations. These include the Pennsylvania Bar Institute, the Pennsylvania Trial Lawyers Association, the Pennsylvania State University Dickinson School of Law, and the National Organization of Social Security Claimants' Representatives. He has also lectured for various support, insurance, and medical groups.

Mr. Rollins received a Bachelor of Science in Computer Science from Lock Haven University of Pennsylvania. He was awarded his Juris Doctorate from Temple University's Beasley School of Law.
