If you change your name, be sure to report the change to us. We will provide you with an updated Social Security card. There's no charge for a Social Security card.



If you lose your spouse, we are there with survivor benefits for many widows, widowers, and children to help you get through the difficult time. From your first job to your last, your employers verify your Social Security number with us to help reduce fraud and improve the accuracy of your earnings records.

Disability benefits provide financial support for workers with a disability and their dependents, including our wounded warriors.
