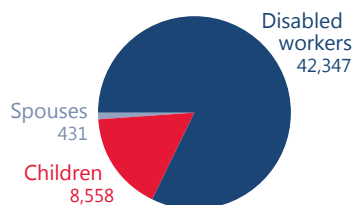
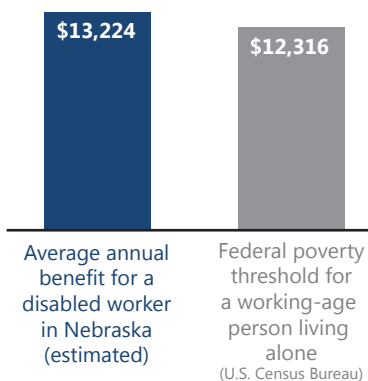




Most DI beneficiaries in Nebraska are disabled workers
