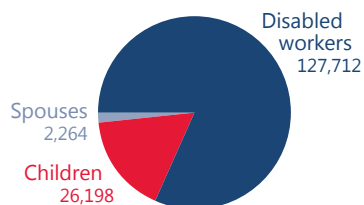
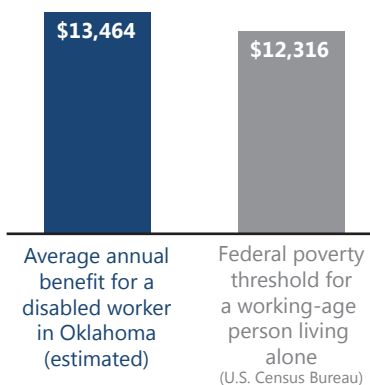




## Most DI beneficiaries in Oklahoma are disabled workers
