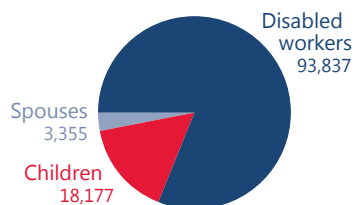
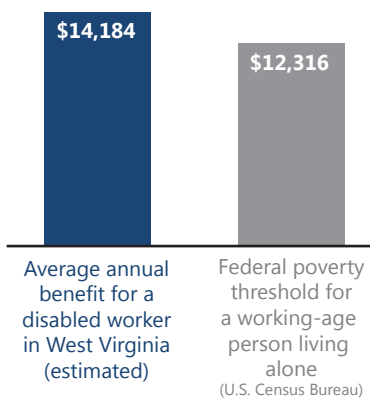




Most DI beneficiaries in West Virginia are disabled workers
