


American Indians and Alaska Natives (AIAN) Aged 62 or Older^a in 2030

In 2030, we project that:

- Almost half of the AIAN population will be in fair or poor health.
- Sixteen percent of the AIAN population will receive Social Security disability benefits at some point.
- Over 50 percent of the AIAN population aged 62 to 67 will have some work limitation.^b
- For the AIAN population, lifetime shared earnings and per capita monthly Social Security benefits will be lower than the total population across the distribution.
- The poverty rate for the AIAN population will be more than twice the poverty rate of all those 62 or older.


Population Characteristics

Percentage with characteristic




Lifetime Shared Earnings

Present value at age 62




Poverty Rates
