

Supplemental Security Income (SSI) for Children

Your child may get monthly SSI payments if they have a disability and your household has limited income and financial resources.



What You Need to Know

Social Security's Definition of Disability

Your child must have a developmental, physical, or mental health condition that limits their activities and is expected to last at least one year or result in death.

How We Decide if Your Child Has a Qualifying Disability

A state agency reviews your child's medical information and makes the medical decision.

We will arrange and pay for an examination or test, if necessary.

We will notify you of the decision by mail in three to six months.
