## Learn what you can do with a my Social Security account



## If you do not receive benefits, you can:

- Request a replacement Social Security card (if you meet certain requirements).
- · Check the status of your application or appeal.
- Get your Social Security Statement, to review:
  - Estimates of your future benefits.
  - The estimated Social Security and Medicare taxes that you have paid.
- Check your earnings to verify the amounts that we posted are correct.
- Get personalized retirement benefit estimates based on the date or age you want to start receiving benefits.
- Get estimates for possible spouse's benefits.
- Get a Benefit Verification Letter stating that:
  - You never received Social Security benefits,
    Supplemental Security Income (SSI), or Medicare.
  - You received benefits in the past, but do not currently receive them.
  - You applied for benefits, but have not received an answer yet.

## If you receive benefits or have Medicare, you can:

- Request a replacement Social Security card (if you meet certain requirements).
- Report your wages if you work and receive Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) benefits or SSI payments.
- Get your Benefit Verification Letter.
- Check your benefit and payment information.
- Update your contact information.
- Start or change direct deposit of your benefit payment.
  (Social Security beneficiaries only)
- Request a replacement Medicare card.
- Get a replacement SSA-1099 or SSA-1042S for tax season.
- Receive notices online, including your cost-of-living (COLA) notice, sooner than you would receive them in the mail.

Your personal my Social Security account is where you go to check your Social Security information and conduct business with us.

To establish an account, you must:

- Have a valid email address.
- Be at least 18 years of age.
- Have a Social Security number.
